

Patrick Henry's Scotchtown

Scotchtown is the only original standing home of Patrick Henry, patriot and orator of the American Revolution. Henry lived here from 1771-1778 and conceived his most influential revolutionary ideas at the home, including the ideas for his famous "Liberty or Death" speech. On March 23, 1775, Henry rode from Scotchtown to St. John's Church in Richmond to deliver the speech.



What to do at Patrick Henry's Scotchtown

- **Guided Tour:** 45 minutes, interpreters cover the life and legacy of Patrick Henry.
- **Self-guided Exhibits:** 45 minutes for self-guided tours of two museum rooms, the kitchen and outbuildings.
- **Museum Store:** Books and souvenirs available for purchase.
- **Covered Pavilion:** 12 picnic tables seat 50+ people. Electrical outlets available.
- **Community Center:** Indoor space available for smaller groups of up to 25 people.

Parking

- **Tour Buses:** Several large tour buses can be accommodated with turn around space through the carriage way.
- **General Parking:** Available in lot, up to 40 cars

Restrooms: Single stall men and 2-stall women's restrooms available for public use.
